A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SETTLEMENT AND EXECUTION OF RELEASES IN THE CONSOLIDATED ACTIONS ENTITLED <u>UNITED STATES OF AMERICA V. BECKMAN COULTER, ET ALS.</u> AND <u>NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION V. AMERICAN THERMOPLASTICS CORP., ET ALS.</u>

WHEREAS, certain claims have been asserted against the Town of Clinton (the "Town") in the consolidated actions entitled <u>United States of America v. Beckman Coulter, Inc., et als.</u> Civil Action No. 98-4812 (WHW) and <u>New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection v. American Thermoplastics Corp., et als.</u> Civil Action No. 98-4781 (WHW) pending in the United States District Court for the District of New Jersey (the "Litigation") regarding alleged environmental contamination at the Combe Fill South Landfill in Chester, New Jersey ("Site"); and

WHEREAS, certain Third-Party Defendant municipalities, school boards, school districts, colleges, park commissions and housing authorities, including the Town are members of a group known as the Municipal Group in the Litigation; and

WHEREAS, the Municipal Group on behalf of its members engaged in settlement negotiations with the United States Department of Justice and the State of New Jersey ("Governmental Plaintiffs") under the supervision of the Honorable Esther Salas, United States Magistrate Judge; and

WHEREAS, the Town executed an escrow agreement and partial consent decree in order to settle the suit on behalf of the Town.

WHERAS, the escrow agreement and partial consent decree require the Town to pay a total of \$368,354.58 in settlement of the Litigation with the Governmental Plaintiffs; and

WHERAS, certain insurance coverage is available to the Town for payment of the settlement of the Litigation, but the insurance coverage is incomplete; and

WHERAS, due to incomplete insurance coverage the Town must pay \$29,468.36 of the \$368,354.58 settlement in order to resolve the Litigation; and

WHERAS, certain insurance carriers are requiring that the Town execute limited releases in exchange for settlement payment; and

WHERAS, the Mayor and Council are authorized under N.J.S.A. 40A:62-1, et seq. to adopt resolutions for any purpose required for the government of the municipality

or for the accomplishment of any public purpose for which the municipality is authorized to act under general law; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body recognizes that the settlement of the Litigation is in the best interests of the Town and desires to effectuate settlement with the governmental plaintiffs, and with the insurance carriers in accordance with the negotiated terms.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Clinton, Hunterdon County, as follows:

- 1. The Mayor, Clerk and other necessary municipal official is hereby authorized to execute a limited release with Travelers Casualty and Surety Company.
