MAYOR'S COMMENTS

- 1. Mayor Schaumburg appointed John Leddy to the Historic Commission at the request of Chairwoman Rosemarie Platt.
- 2. The Town of Clinton received notification of award of the Safe Routes to School grant in the amount of \$225,000.00. Mayor Schaumburg thanked Laurie Insel for her hard work and dedication in applying for grants. Mrs. Insel explained that this will assist in the engineering portion of the project, beginning at the Clinton House to New Street on Old Highway 22. Mrs. Insel will be applying for the building portion in 2009. As with the Vision Study, affected property owners will be notified and invited to attend meetings pertaining to the project.
- 3. The Department of Transportation has denied the grant to the Town for the Union Road / Rachel Court Project. A total of \$300,000 would be necessary to do both Projects. Mayor Schaumburg assured Council and audience that letters have been sent to DOT asking them to reconsider, especially because Union Road takes the brunt of of traffic congestion when Route I 78 is backed up during the morning commute.
- 4. Many thanks to Councilman Robert Ragozine for three years of amazing service. As a councilman, he was on the Parks and Playgrounds, Building and Grounds, and other important committees where many things were accomplished. The Mayor, Council and Town are grateful to him for his service.

Mayor Schaumburg explained that any changes must be addressed by the Planning Board following Mr. Hintz's opinion.
