PUBLIC COMMENTS

Walter Hetzel, 36 West Main Street, wished to express his appreciation to Mayor Richard Miller for the six months of service acting as the interim mayor. Mr. Hetzel stated Mayor Miller was a classic example of governance and thanked him!

MAYOR'S COMMENTS

Mayor Miller thanked Mr. Hetzel and said his comments were along the same lines. Mayor Miller addressed his colleagues and thanked everyone for their support. He stated that on January 2, 2012 the re-organization meeting will swear in Mayor Kovach and he wishes her a smooth and congenial transition. Mayor Miller thanked Mayor Pro-Tem, Robert B. Smith, P.E., for his kindness and for acting as his strong right arm, exhibiting an institutional memory and for his support and advice.

On a different topic, Mayor Miller proceeded to explain that the Sewer Committee is seeking to hire a new employee. He stressed that in these economic times across the country, he cannot bring himself to hire an additional employee. He continued to explain his reasoning for not hiring a new employee for \$35,000 with a fringe package comes to approximately \$47,200. During 2011, per the agreement with CTSA, the Town received \$60,000 all used for operating the sewer system Mayor Miller said he will be voting no to the idea of hiring a new employee for the Sewer Department. Mr. Smith challenged the Mayor's theory. He said with the increased work for CTSA and one employee at the Treatment Plant that was never replaced, we won't be able to keep up with the contract. Hiring a new employee will cut down on overtime at the Wastewater Treatment Plant and that person would be paid 100% by the Sewer Utility. Mr. Pendergast, Chairman of the Sewer Committee, stated he would have appreciated not being pre-empted with the Mayor's speech before the Council reports were given. Mr. Pendergast intended to make his plea for a new employee at that time. CTSA rate payers received savings when Mr. Ross retired from CTSA and our employees are pulling their weight. With a major construction project in the near future at our WWTP and manpower being down, it is necessary to hire a new person. Mr. Naples, PW/BA stated that the agreement with CTSA places added responsibility on our employee's operators licenses, having to prepare quarterly reports and maintaining their aging

equipment. Councilwoman Insel stated that we are working with a barebones staff and we are taking on additional work.

A motion was made by Mr. Pendergast, seconded by Mr. Smith, to hire a new full time employee at the Sewer Treatment Plant.
