COMPREHENSIVE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT STRATEGY PRESENTATION

Freeholders Matthew Holt and Deputy Director Suzanne Lagay attended this evening's meeting along with Sue Dziamara, Director of Department of Planning Economic Development and Land Use and Ken Bogen, Principal Planner for the Division of Planning Services for Hunterdon County to present a plan for the future of Hunterdon County.

Copies of the plan were distributed to Mayor, Council and the audience and are made available through the office of the County Department of Planning website: http://www.co.hunterdon.nj.us/ Freeholder Holt began by showing how the County has changed from the 1970 to 2000 era compared to current statistics 2000 to 2015. He also compared the "Baby Boomers" to the "Millennials" and discussed their needs. Freeholder Holt stressed the importance of addressing housing, amenities such as cultural and recreational groups and accessibility for a walkable community and transportation, not only to New York City but to places such as high business districts of Morristown, Chester, Princeton and others. Freeholder Holt suggested Council take the time to visit the Flemington Bid, Business Improvement District, website for a cursory review of positive planning.

Freeholder Lagay addressed preparing for the 2016 – 2018 Master Plan review for Clinton and the need to incorporate thoughts discussed this evening. Grants available from the Federal Government to assist in the process and the opportunities the CEDS program would like to pursue in partnering with the municipalities. The entire presentation moved quickly and provided an informative outline.

WHEREAS, the Town of Clinton (the "Town") has filed a Declaratory Judgment Action in the Superior Court of New Jersey, Hunterdon County in furtherance of the Supreme Court's March 10, 2015 decision captioned <u>In re Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 & 5:97 by N.J. Council on Affordable Housing</u>, 221 N.J. 1 (2015) (the "Supreme Court Decision"); and

WHEREAS, the Town of Clinton entered into a Municipal Shared Services Defense Agreement (hereinafter "MSSDA") in order to hire Dr. Robert W. Burchell via Rutgers University to produce an expert report in order to establish the Township's affordable housing obligation; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Burchell is unable to perform his duties under the MSSDA due to health issues; and

WHEREAS, Rutgers seeks to terminate the MSSDA; and

WHEREAS, it has been proposed to the member municipalities to hire Econsult Solutions, having an address at 1435 Walnut Street, Suite 300, Philadelphia, PA 19102, to replace Dr. Burchell because Econsult appears to be the only qualified expert in the area of New Jersey affordable housing obligations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Clinton as follows:

- 1. The Town of Clinton hereby authorizes the substitution of Econsult as an expert under the MSSDA
- 2. The Mayor be and is hereby authorized to execute an addendum to the MSSDA to that effect subject to approval of the Town Attorney.
- 3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

RESOLUTION #124-15 – SUPPORT OF DELAWARE TOWNSHIP

A motion was made by Ms. Sosidka, seconded by Ms. Dineen, to adopt Resolution #124-15 as submitted:

RESOLUTION #124-15 SUPPORT OF DELAWARE TOWNSHIP VS PENNEAST PIPELINE COMPANY LLC

WHEREAS the Township of Delaware is continuing to oppose the PennEast Pipeline Company, L.L.C. to construct a 36" diameter natural gas pipeline within Delaware Township; and

WHEREAS the proposed pipeline routes will cross preserved farmlands, open space, environmentally-constrained lands, Category One streams and tributaries, habitats of species protected by the Endangered Species Act, and properties of significant historic and cultural value; and

WHEREAS any disturbance of the aforementioned lands, species and historic sites by survey work is deemed as potentially harmful and could result in irreparable harm; and

WHEREAS on July 30, 2015 the New Jersey Conservation Foundation, a valued partner in the preservation of hundreds of acres of Township open space and farmland, issued a declaration to "cease and desist unauthorized entry and survey activities" on New Jersey Conservation's properties in response to the "discovery that PennEast surveyors entered land owned by New Jersey Conservation Foundation and Hunterdon Land Trust" without the permission of the owners;

WHEREAS, by Resolution #2015-57 dated August 10, 2015 the Township of Delaware denied PennEast Pipeline Company, LLC all survey access to Township-owned property or property in which the Township has a legal interest

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mayor and Council of the Town of Clinton support the efforts of Delaware Township to protect their land and landowners.

ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 11-03 WHICH AUTHORIZED MUNICIPAL MAINTENANCE OF GEORGES PLACE EXTENSION

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 11-03 authorized the Department of Public Works to perform certain maintenance on Georges Place Extension, a private road; and

WHEREAS, the Road Committee has evaluated the cost of maintaining Georges Place Extension and the potential costs of maintaining other private roads; and

WHEREAS, the funds available for municipal operations have been significantly curbed at the same time the municipal costs have increased significantly, thereby reducing the funds available for municipal operations; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have concluded that it is in the public interest to terminate maintenance activities on Georges Place Extension.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Clinton, Hunterdon County, New Jersey, that Ordinance No. 11-03 is repealed and the Town of Clinton will no longer provide maintenance to Georges Place Extension.

This Ordinance will become effective upon passage in accordance with law.

INTRODUCTION OF ORDINANCE #15-16 – PAWNBROKERS AND DEALERS

Mr. Rylak voiced his concerns regarding this proposed ordinance, such as fees that shops would incur for just performing a courtesy to their customers. Chief Matheis explained that this ordinance would put the information into a statewide data base for law enforcement agencies investigating theft of property. A few questions remained and a suggestion to have someone from the Prosecutor's office attend a meeting to answer questions prior to introduction. A motion was made by Mr. Carberry, seconded by Ms. Sosidka, to withdraw the motion to introduce this evening and to table the introduction to October 13, 2015 allowing the Prosecutor's office to answer Council's questions.
